


WELCOME TO THE FIRST EDITION OF OUR COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER!




WAGMATCOOK HEALTH CENTRE

CONSTRUCTION OF ELDERS COMPLEXES

If you've passed by **Beach Road** recently, you may have noticed construction is well underway on an exciting new project! Work has officially begun on four new Elder's complexes, offering much-needed housing in a beautiful, peaceful location along the water.

This development will provide safe, comfortable and accessible homes for our Elders, allowing them to enjoy their surroundings in a quiet, scenic part of the community. Units are anticipated to be completed by May 2025. We look forward to seeing this project come to life and the positive impact it will have for our Elders and their families. VOTE TAKING PLACE FOR THE COMMUNITY NAME CHANGE

Purpose:

As a result of the community poll which was in favour of a Community name change, Wagmatcook Council are conducting a community-wide vote to decide to officially change the name of our community from Wagmatcook to the traditional Mi'kmaq spelling - Waqmitkuk. This vote allows all registered members to have a say in honoring and preserving our Mi'kmaq heritage by using the authentic name of our land.

Voting Process and Eligibility:

Team members will be visiting each home as part of this door-to-door campaign to collect votes directly from community members. You'll have an opportunity to review both options, ask questions if needed, and cast your vote. Ballots will also be mailed out to registered members who are living off-reserve. If you are missed during the door-to-door campaign, there will be a voting station held at the Cultural Centre.

To cast a vote in this process, all individuals must:

- be a registered Wagmatcook band member
- be 18 years of age and older
- must provide valid proof of identification in order to vote

COMMUNITY FLAG POLE



If you've passed by the
Cultural Centre recently, you
may have noticed a new 60
foot flagpole standing proudly
— the tallest flagpole in a
Mi'kmaq community. This
impressive addition is more
than just a landmark — it
represents unity, pride, and
respect for our community.

The flagpole will serve as a powerful symbol of honour, with the flag **lowered to half-mast whenever we lose a community member** (starting the first day of the wake, and returning to full-mast the day after the funeral) — a gesture of remembrance and respect for those who have left us.

We are proud to have this meaningful addition to our community, reminding us to stand together in both times of celebration and remembrance.
